

Last month we were able to host a Fall Break program for our students at the elementary school. During our three-day program, students had rich activities like math and literacy via I-Ready, science, team building, virtual fieldtrips, as well as art sessions. In addition, we were able to provide a breakfast,

lunch and a supper for our students. Our fun spirit days were a hit for this program, students enjoyed the Western Day, Pajama Day, and wear your RED Day for our fieldtrip to Regal Cinema to watch Clifford the big Red

Dog. After over a year of not going to field trips students were very excited to have a field trip. For our Kinder and 1st graders, this was the first time being in a school bus. All 74 students that were served asked when we were having another camp.

## Students at the Middle School Engage in Robotics and Science Activities

During Thanksgiving break the middle school after school program offered three days of programming. The program was open for all students to attend and we provided students with enrichment activities consisting of team building, academics, geometric abstract art, and science. Students were able to participate in hands-on activities creating their artwork based on what they learned from artist Kazimir Malevich. Students participating in a science decathlon learned about the Apollo 11 mission to the moon. Students were able to create their own astronaut lander using straws, marshmallows, cups and



cardboard. Classes were split into three groups and each group was in charge of their own project. Each class had to create a bridge, egg drop and a rocket with the materials provided. We had spirit days and provided a field trip for all students who attended the program. Students left the program very pleased receiving yummy snacks that included chips, juice, cotton candy, and candy apples. Overall it was a great program.

## Students at Gratts Primary Center Learn about College



Teachers at Gratts Primary Center have been engaging the students in different STEM and art activities. During the students' learning center time, which is when teachers reinforce subjects their students are learning in the school day, hands on activities are one of their most favorites. First grade students in Ms. Sanchez's class learned about the life cycle of an apple as well as explore how different color apples tasted. Students in Ms. Sanchez's class taste tested red, yellow, and green apples. Her students then shared notes and described their favorite apple. As part of adding to what each student curious minds wonder, students in Ms. Sanchez's class also wanted to find out the weight of their apples using wood blocks. Our students at Gratts Primary Center have started to make connections between academic achievement and career aspirations. All students in the afterschool program participated in the college awareness activities. Student explored their personal interests matched them to career

learning how long it took the artist to make each sculpture. Students were very fascinated by how real the graphics looked on the screen and how it almost felt real to them. Apart from experiencing these two amazing exhibits, students and teachers also went to explore the ecosystem exhibit which allowed them to get up and close to different livings organisms such as starfish, plants, and fish. Discovering how big the Endeavour was to the students was mesmerizing. Getting to learn more about the missions the Endeavour went to spark the student's curiosity when they

found out that it had been transported on land to the science center. The California Science Center field trip was one of the biggest highlights for many of our students who were their first time going on a school field trip.
