Students in the afterschool program at Gratts Primary Center displayed their dance skills during their winter performance. Students and teachers practice daily to master their performance and to proudly record it for their parents and love ones. Apart



from developing their confidence and self-esteem during their winter performance, students also participated in activities such as making their own gingerbread houses using various edible materials and decorating their own Christmas tree.

Fridays at our Middle School is about Student Choice

In January 2022, the after school program at the middle school hit the ground running with our parallel programs. Every Friday starting at 3:15 pm, students from 6th grade meet with Robotics instructor Dylan, from Digital Dragon. For about an hour, students continue learning and reinforcing their 21st century skills as they use iPads to program robots constructed with legos. Students have successfully been able to make their robots spin around 360 degrees, have them travel in a straight line, and learned that the core body of their robots called "brains" will not travel if they sense



something in their way even if they get programmed to move. Students have also quickly recognized that problem solving is crucial when programming their robots. Troubleshooting with a partner is highly encouraged as well before turning to the instructor when their robots aren't functioning properly. Overall students have shown a genuinely big interest when participating in the Robotics class that oftentimes they don't want it to end.

This month the afterschool team would like to highlight Ms. Ana Rojas. Ana started with us in the afterschool program as an Associate Teacher. First grade students in Ms. Sanchez's class have been learning about sculptures and how they are 3D objects that they can build or make using different materials. In her class, students used paper to create sculptures out of their

imagination. Students in Transitional Kinder and Kinder with Ms. Nava and Ms. Valles have been working on developing their students' fine motor skills. Students in T.K. and Kinder have cut, pasted, and molded various materials to develop their hand and eye coordination.
